In addition, ASCA Members requested the Premier, you and Ministers whose portfolios intersect with education be made aware of some of these Advocacy Policies. The Honourable Danielle Smith, Premier; The Honourable Dan Williams, Minister of Mental Health and Addiction; The Honourable Pete Guthrie, Minister of Infrastructure; The Honourable Ric McIver, Minister of Municipal Affairs.

Provincially, the ASCA Board and Executive appreciate the opportunity to provide the advice and feedback received from parents on Alberta's legislated school councils, with respect to new and ongoing Alberta Education initiatives and/or legislation/policies impacting education. We believe a collaborative process results in an enhanced education system focused on the learning success of all Alberta's students.

The ASCA Member adopted Advocacy Policy which include reference to the Minister of Health, which ASCA Members indicated verbally should also be brought to the attention of the Minister of Mental Health and Addiction, is:

## P24-02 – Funding for More Assessments of Learning Disabilities

That the Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) advocates to the Minister of Education and the Minister of Health for new and targeted funding for increased availability of professionals to help diagnose learning disabilities and support neurodivergent children.

In addition, ASCA Members believe that as Minister of Health, you should be aware of this adopted Advocacy Policy. Should it be funded by the Government of Alberta, and implemented province-wide, it will have a positive impact on the health of Alberta's students, and by extension all families and communities in Alberta.

## P24-03 – Improving Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) in Alberta Classrooms & Shared Environments

That the Alberta School Councils' Association (ASCA) advocates to the Minister of Education for increased funding for modern HVAC systems for health & learning (with air filtration and cooling systems) not only in new schools but retrofitted in older school buildings as well.
